## **Future Air Force Panel - New Generation Aircraft 2022**

### Overview

NATO members are confronting the new reality that era of uncontested airspace is ending. Czech Air Force, like many other NATO Air Forces, consisting of fourth-generation aircraft, might face the insurmountable problem of having to survive in a highly lethal air-defense environment, while attempting to strike critical targets in future multidomain operations.

Threats to Western freedom of access to the air domain include, but are not limited to, advanced integrated air defense systems, adversary fifth-generation combat air systems and advanced precision strike capabilities which threaten airbases and maintenance hubs. There is, therefore, a collective defense imperative for NATO air forces to maintain or in some cases regain credible warfighting capabilities against modern state-based threats.

Acquisition of the new aircraft is no doubt both militarily and technologically most important and challenging defense project for the Czech MoD. We must see the new aircraft not only as a platform but rather as a system. New generation aircraft must be able to operate in future multidomain operations and will become a part of the new concept of Future Combat Air System (FCAS).

This conference will serve as a platform where all key stakeholders – users, defense industry and academia – will meet and will have a chance to address complexity of the acquisition process, as well as to introduce the new aircraft systems to the Czech Air Force. Therefore, all stakeholders will have a chance to actively participate and present their point of view within all planned panels.
